| Day 1 | Workshop Introduction [objective/purpose of workshop] [Setting the Scene: one or two presentations, presenters to be indentified] What is monitoring? Why we do monitoring? What the purpose is for monitoring? |
| Day 1 | Who are the resource managers and What monitoring is <u>happening in countries</u> (country presentations, around 10 minutes) Country representatives to present short presentation on who are resources managers, what monitoring is occurring and what the objective of the monitoring countries are undertaking, and what are the constraints What monitoring has LMMA and other NGOs been doing what has worked, lessons learned (presentations); General discussion |
| Day 2 | What are we monitoring for? What are the different <u>management questions</u> that need answers? (first group session) Participants asked to list their “top 10” management questions Results are presented at plenary and any similar questions amalgamated so one list is compiled Grouping of management questions that were compiled from the plenary session (second group session) Some questions may not be management focused so rework the question or delete Any additional management questions added from plenary discussion Results discussed and agreed at plenary |
| Day 3 morning | Using the agreed list of management questions, complete first matrix that looks at the different monitoring approaches (third group session) Plenary session so that all agree on the matrix |
| Day 3 afternoon | Move information from matrix 1 to matrix 2 which looks at what to collect and monitor (including biological data) by survey/monitoring methodology by appropriate management question (fourth group session). The final column is to form a summary Plenary session to discuss and agree on summary of what to collect or monitor for each survey or monitoring type. |
| Day 4 morning (try to start on day 3) | Move summary information from matrix 2 to matrix 3 for expansion into how to collect and how often etc. (fifth group session) Plenary session to discuss and agree where possible |
| Day 4 afternoon | Reality check: what monitoring is realistic for countries based on staff capacity and financial resources (suggest prioritizing what is on the third matrix to come up with a final matrix) |
